GOSPEL

Mk 10.35-45

(For shorter form, read between > <) >A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.<

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached Jesus. 'Master,' they said to him, 'we want you to do us a favour.' He said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory.' 'You do not know what you are asking' Jesus said to them. 'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so >Jesus called them to him and said to them, 'You know that among the pagans their socalled rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for manv.

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION


Nourished by these redeeming gifts, we pray, O Lord, that through this help to eternal salvation true faith may ever increase. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE WORD

Psalter week 1



The sons of Zebedee seem to have belonged to a better off family than Peter and his brother Andrew, their neighbours. Their father was able to employ hired hands in his small fishing fleet.

Like young men of ambitious family, they probably assumed they had a better claim than their poorer neighbours to positions of influence when the Kingdom Jesus was proclaiming would soon be set in place. They will leave nothing to chance. Drawing him aside, they ask for a favour – the two best jobs in the kingdom. Matthew seems so unable to believe their brazenness that when he tells the story, he passes the blame on to their mother's ambition.

Jesus replies that they do not realise what they are asking for. If they want to belong to his inner circle, then they must drain the cup of suffering he will drink or be baptised in his baptism. Baptism here does not mean pouring a little water, but drenching, soaking or submerging in the deep waters of death that will leave them gasping for air.

When the other disciples realise that the brothers are trying to take advantage of them, a row breaks out. Jesus calls them and gives them a lesson on the meaning of discipleship. Following him is not about being in control. It is not about having power or influence. They need to learn from him what it means to be servant, to take the last place.

REFLECT

atherine de Hueck Doherty was born into a Russian aristocratic family. When the First World War broke out, she went to serve as a nurse at the front. The Russian revolution rendered her homeless. With a young husband, she wandered through much of Europe in search of a home. eventually settling in Canada where her marriage broke down. Deeply dissatisfied, Catherine was in search of spiritual roots. Eventually, she gave up everything she had to work with the poorest of the poor, establishing a series of Friendship Houses for their care.

Catherine knew that not everyone might be called to such radical service. She realised that every moment brought its own call to service. "The duty of the moment is what you should be doing at any given time, in whatever place God has put you. You may not have Christ in a homeless person at your door, but you may have a little child. If you have a child, your duty of the moment may be to change a dirty diaper. So you do it. But you don't just change that diaper, you change it to the best of your ability, with great love for both God and that child.... There are all kinds of good Catholic things you can do, but whatever they are, you have to realize that there is always the duty of the moment to be done. And it must be done, because the duty of the moment is the duty of God."

On this Mission Sunday, think about how you can help in the mission of the church, especially in regions where poverty and hunger reign.

PRAY

Pray this week for missionaries – laypeople, religious and priests – especially those who are natives of your local parish.

SAY

Send labourers, Lord, into your harvest.

LEARN

The 'sacrament of the present moment' means that God offers us grace and love at every moment of our life.

For followers of Jesus, service is not something grudging but a joy.

In the Eucharist, Jesus serves us. Our best thanksgiving is to serve others in return.

DO
