GOSPEL Mk 8:27-35

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Jesus and his disciples left for the villages round Caesarea Philippi. On the way he put this question to this disciples, 'Who do people say I am?' And they told him. 'John the Baptist,' they said, 'others Elijah; others again, one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he asked 'who do you say I am?' Peter spoke up and said to him, 'You are the Christ.' And he gave them strict orders not to tell anyone about him.

And he began to teach them that the Son of Man was destined to suffer grievously, to be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and to be put to death, and after three days to rise again; and he said all this quite openly. 

It was probably embarrassing enough for the disciples when Jesus asked them who people thought he was. It was even more embarrassing when the question got personal- "Who do you think I am?"

It is easy to imagine a few moments of stunned and uncomfortable silence, broken only by Peter blurting out, "You are the Messiah." Yes, the rest of them agreed. That is what he was and it would only be a matter of another week or so before they reached Jerusalem for Passover. Then he would declare himself publicly as the Son of David and his reign as king of Israel would begin in earnest. As part of his inner circle, life could only get better for them.

Yet this is where the conversation takes a sharp turn. What lies ahead is not a throne, but a cross. It is not a cheering crowd that awaits them but a jeering one. There will be no pleasures of the royal palace but pain and death. Peter, ever the optimist, pulls him aside. That is no way to talk, he tells him, it will only frighten the others. Jesus

Spend some time this week reflecting honestly on Jesus' question: "Who am I for you?"

turns on him. Peter is a tempter, a Satan.

Following Jesus is a matter of total selfforgetfulness. No self-respecting human being wanted to end up on a cross. Roman citizens were spared the cross and it was reserved for slaves and revolutionaries. A character in a play written about two hundred years before Christ, says: "Don't threaten me. I know that the cross will be my grave. That is where all my ancestors were laid to rest - my father, and my grandfather, and my great-grandfather, and my great-great-grandfather." For a slave, the cross was a 'no hope' sign. It was the sign of death. Yet it will be the door into eternal life for the follower of Jesus. The crucifixion will not be the final episode in his life. It will be followed by the glory of Faster.

PRAY

Pray especially this week for young men and women who, at this time of year, are faced with choices that may determine the shape of the rest of their lives.

LEARN

Sometimes my failures and sins can provide an opportunity to start again if I learn to be truly sorry for them.

REFLECT



reaching on this scene at one of his regular morning Masses, Pope Francis reminded us that we can understand the question Jesus asked Peter, "Who am I for you?" only after having travelled a long path. Given our human frailty, that path will probably be a path of both grace and sin, a path of daily struggle. It is the disciple's path because "following Jesus enables us to know Jesus. We follow him through our virtues, but we also follow him through our sins." To answer Jesus' question when it is directed to each of us, the Pope went on, it is not enough to draw on abstract ideas, even religious ones. What is needed is the life experience of a disciple. It is through daily struggles, our victories and our weaknesses, that we come to know who he is. Taking stock of my daily life will probably help me to answer that question, "Who is Christ for me?". ■
