
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THE WORD

Year B • Season Colour: White • Psalter Week 4



At the beginning of Matthew's account of the Gospel story, the angel instructs Joseph to name Mary's child *Emmanuel*, which means *God is with us*. At the very end of the Gospel, this theme returns when Jesus tells the eleven disciples in Galilee after his resurrection "I am with you, yes, to the end of time."

He has minimised the human side of Jesus and omitted many of the little touches which make Mark's version so readable and attractive. He puts Jesus forward in the light of the resurrection as *Kyrios*, the glorified one: the terrified disciples address him as such when the storm breaks out over their boat on the Sea of Galilee. In this final appearance, the eleven recognise him as such by falling down before him: this is an act of adoration, just as others, such as the Magi, the leper, and the centurion prostrate themselves when Jesus reveals his power in an act of divine power. This is something people should only do in the presence of God, so it tells us that these individuals recognise Jesus as divine, as God. The evangelist declares that Jesus in himself shows the right attitude to God by accepting baptism from John and thus *do all that righteousness commands*. Thus Jesus is the model for his disciples.

The community of Jesus' disciples is to be missionary: it is not to keep the Good News to itself, but to convey what they have received to others. Those who accept their message will signify this publicly by being baptised "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit". God has given Jesus all authority in heaven and on earth: in this final scene he gives his disciples a command and a promise. He is giving that command and promise to us today.

# REFLECT

t is notoriously difficult to try to explain the Trinity, One God in Three Persons. In England in the 19th century there was a determined attack on the doctrine of the Trinity by certain individuals. William Wilberforce, the Bishop of Oxford, wrote a book defending it. There was a feeling in certain quarters that Wilberforce's attempted defence had done more damage than had the attacks of his opponents.

The 13th-century mystic Meister Eckhart had a different approach. He asked: "Do you want to know what goes on in the core of the Trinity? I will tell you. In the

core of the Trinity, the Father laughs and gives birth to the Son. The Son laughs back at the Father and gives birth to the Spirit. The whole Trinity laughs and gives birth to us."

We have not often been encouraged by preachers or spiritual writers to picture God laughing, or to imagine the Trinity as a community of persons characterised by joy, a joy which overflows in creative, loving being and activity. Perhaps if we did, our own faith would be more joyful and deeply serene, our communities less fractious and more accepting, and our Church more attractive as a place of peace and that joy of which Jesus speaks.

# **LEARN**

The command to baptise in the name of the Father, Son and Spirit, reflects the practice of the early Christian community.

Being baptised is a public affirmation to accept Jesus and the Gospel.

The history of the early Church revolves around the debates as to how the persons of the Trinity relate to one another.

The Bible stresses the unity of God: there is only one God.



# DO

Make the Sign of the Cross with holy water. Renew your baptismal promises informally in the name of the Trinity. Ask for the wisdom and courage to be a missionary disciple of Jesus in your own life and place.

### SAY

I am with you always.
