

Matthew continues his presentation of the teaching of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount. The teaching about an eye for an eye is often held up as illustrating the superiority of the Gospel over the supposed savagery of the Hebrew Bible (the Old Testament).

However, the law of retaliation, as it is known, was, in fact, an attempt to limit violence and to prevent fairly minor incidents escalating into full-blown vendettas. The text really means only an eye for an eye: the punishment had to be in proportion to the offence or injury. Jesus then goes on to advocate meeting any kind of vicious treatment with goodness.

Jesus also expands the meaning of one's neighbour. In some quarters, this term was understood to apply only to members of one's family or tribe and so a person's responsibilities extended no further than that. But as in much of his teaching, especially in the parables, Jesus is challenging his disciples to look at the world as God does. God's blessings in nature are not restricted to any privileged group or withheld from the apparently undeserving. God's attitude should be the standard for the disciples of Jesus: we are to be perfect, like our Heavenly Father, in God's concern for all people.

# LEARN

The doctrine of an eye for an eye is known as the *Lex talionis*, or the law of retaliation.

It actually means only an eye for an eye: revenge has to be in proportion to the offence.

It was developed to restrict the spread of violence and the practice of vendetta.

# REFLECT

here are perhaps few passages in the Gospel which are more challenging than this one. On the one hand, we have the example of the Hindu Mahatma Gandhi who personified this teaching of Jesus and showed what can be achieved by a policy of nonviolence. We have the figure of Archbishop Oscar Romero who was murdered after calling on the army of his country to stop the oppression. On the other, arguments rage over how to oppose injustice on the national and international scene. It is all too clear that there is no agreement on how to apply this teaching of Jesus about the nonviolent response and attitude to people whom we regard as hostile to us.

But the complexity of the wider question does not mean that we can ignore Jesus' teaching for our own personal lives. Even if we can only decide that it means treating everyone else with respect simply because they are human beings like ourselves, that would be a start. We could also examine ourselves and see if we are bearing grudges and waiting for the opportunity to get our own back over some slight or insult (real or imagined). At the very least, we might discover that we feel better in ourselves if we forgive those others and lay down the burden of anger and resentment which we have been carrying around.

## DO

Note from the news bulletins and papers how much war and strife is due to people bearing grudges and refusing to talk to each other. Resolve not to add to the hatred and ill-feeling in the world.
