We are praying for a successor who, working alongside Fr HP, can take the the community forward. Keep up those prayers!

Fr HP will be out of action for the next few weeks due to a broken wrist. We are looking for priests to cover my holiday time at the end of this month. The office is as busy as ever!

We continue to broadcast and record our 11:30 Mass on FaceBook, and have viewers in the US, UK, Ireland and Australia, to name but a few places we reach; this has been one useful discovery we have made: that it's relatively simply to reach many others who can't be with us in person, but who wish to be with us in spirit. Another joyful discovery has been the further creation of 'sacred spaces' in our homes, a little 'holy corner' that can help in our personal and family prayer.
