### Message from Fr Ed

I am currently in Cambridge in quarantine, and have had the time and space to reflect on my time with you in Luxembourg, and on the wonderful Mass on Sunday – the great spirit of joy (albeit tinged with sadness) so evidently present is still with me. It has been a true privilege to minister with you and to be part of a community that is so alive, so attentive and joyful in prayer, and so sensitive and generous to those in need.

Before I focus on Sunday, a word about the previous Wednesday evening when I received a wonderful surprise. I celebrated the French Mass, and noticed Kristine in the congregation, which was unusual for a weekday. At the end of Mass, I was invited into the garden where I was ambushed by a gospel choir! Caroline and other members, who had given the gospel music workshop for us last year, were assembled and sang various songs they had taught us. It was a wonderful, touching half hour – many thanks to all involved.

Back to Sunday. A big 'thank-you' to everyone who contributed in any way to Sunday's celebration – I know that there were teams at work setting up the 'garden church', welcoming (and disinfecting!), serving, reading, distributing communion, and, of course, making music (especial thanks to Klaus to come from Italy to sing 10,000 reasons).

I was overwhelmed by the kind words said by the Cardinal, Alex Isaebert, John and Nicola; while the praise was being heaped on me, I just wanted to hold up a giant mirror so the praise would go to you too, who deserve it.

The presentation to me, including the superb watercolour of Luxembourg and the photo album, was very generous indeed, as were the individual gifts I received, and I am truly grateful. I have a dilemma, though: I have decided to buy a bicycle, but can't decide whether I will buy a pedal bike to keep me fit, or give in to my advancing age and buy an electric/hybrid one: should I give in to the temptation of an easy life or not... I'll let you know what I decide!

I hope to be back in Luxembourg from time to time and to catch up with you after Mass.
