**The Octave of Our Lady 2021** began last weekend. The tradition of the Octave of Our Lady, Mother of God goes back almost 400 years to the 1620s. At the time, Europe was riven by sectarian conflict during the Thirty Years War and the population had been decimated by the plague. The people of Luxembourg identified Our Lady, Mother of God, as “Consoler of the Afflicted” - and a pilgrimage to and veneration of the statue of Our Lady began, which continues to the present day.
