



Pope Francis has issued a worldwide invitation to all the faithful to give voice to their experience in their local Church. This will be the first phase of the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, whose theme is *“For a Synodal Church: communion, participation and mission”*. The process started in October 2021 and will culminate in October 2023.

Our English-speaking Community is contributing to this process through the framework established by the Archdiocese of Luxembourg. The first step is a general consultation (online and on paper). **We hope many of you will take part and offer here some guidance on how to do so.**

We urge you to opt for the online consultation, as this makes results analysis much easier; however, a paper version will also be made available. You will be informed via the Community website (www.catholic.lu/synod-2021-2023) when the online consultation is activated; the paper version will be made available in St Alphonse Church as of the weekend of February 12/13.

Answering the questions: We recommend you take your time before filling in the form. Sit around a table (virtual or otherwise) for a discussion with family, friends, acquaintances, including those who may be on the fringes of our Church, or have left it. Once you are ready, please fill in the form as completely as you can (however, no questions are compulsory). Bear in mind that the best answers (and easiest to collate faithfully afterwards) will be clear and concise, which is why there is a limit set to the length of answers.

We very much want to hear from you about your experience of the Church; however, to ensure that the consultation remains anonymous, we ask you to please not include personally identifiable information in your answers.

Once completed, you can send in the paper version to the Parish Office, either directly or via the greeters team at the weekend Masses. For both the online and paper versions, we ask that you send in your contribution **by March 2nd (Ash Wednesday)**.

Throughout March, we hope to hold a number of other events (small discussion groups, a community workshop) prior to preparing our contribution for inclusion in the Archdiocese’s overall report to the Synod Office in Rome.

Synod prayer Adsumus, Sancte Spiritus (*attributed to Saint Isidore of Seville (c. 560 - 4 April 636)*)

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name.

We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder.
